To reach the start of the Yellow Zone you need to keep walking past our Bolivian Squirrel Monkeys.

GATES TO WANYAMA

Welcome to the Yellow Zone! Spend time walking with your group and learn facts about our amazing animals here at Chessington World of Adventures Resort.

MEERKATS

They use their sharp claws for digging in the sand to find food. Meerkats can close their ears so that sand does not get in them. They like to eat lots of different things like vegetables, to snakes, and even scorpions.

ANKOLE CATTLE

They can weigh up to 500kg! They also have very big horns to protect themselves from predators or animals that might want to hurt them.

DORCAS GAZELLE

These animals are very quick and can run at speeds up to 96km/h; they are faster than some of our rollercoasters here! They only eat vegetables which mean they are herbivores.

GREVY'S ZEBRA

Each Zebra has completely different stripes. They are herbivores and mostly consume grasses, fruit, bark and leaves.

ROTHSCHILD GIRAFFE

These animals are our tallest here and are about the same size as a double decker bus. Our Giraffes have very tall necks; they use these to be able to reach the trees for food they like. Their favourite food is leaves from the acacia tree.

OSTRICH

You may be able to spot our Ostrich. They are different colours, the Ostrich with black feathers is our male called Oscar and the other two lighter Ostriches are our females.

FUN FACT:
Squirrel monkeys have many different calls and noises which they use to talk to each other. They also use their senses of smell to communicate by waving on their hands to mark the areas they live in.

RED ROUTE ANIMALS

Start at the beginning of Trail of the Kings.

1. Western Lowland Gorillas

Q: In what habitat would you find Western Lowland Gorillas in the wild?
A: Forest Habitat

Q: What are the threats to Western Lowland Gorillas?
A: Poaching and Disease - Human Causes

2. Asiatic Lions

Q: Our Lions are carnivores. What does this mean?
A: They eat meat

Q: Our Lions have very defined canine teeth. Why is this important for them?
A: They are carnivores and need large canines to rip and eat their meat.

3. CCF - Chessington Conservation Fund

Conservation is a vital aspect of a Zoo and at this stop you can read all about the important projects that we support. CCF helps lots of conservation projects and last year we gave away over £100,000 to different causes.

4. Activity Time - Who Am I?

End of Lions Activity Area
'Who am I' is a quick fire game, we have given you some ideas to use but we encourage you to let the students come up with some of their own!

- How To Play:
1. Split the groups into teams
 2. Encourage your class to work in teams to figure out the animals based on the clues you give them
 3. We have given you with two different animals to get you started.
 4. If they guess correctly they score a point, if they do not then continue with the clues for the other teams
 5. The winner is the team with the most points!

5. Final Stop - Test your knowledge

Take a minute to test the children's knowledge on everything they have just learnt as you stop by our Clouded Leopards. Re-visit the questions asked and encourage the children to share one fact they found interesting around their walk through Trail of the Kings.

This ride was opened in 1998 and is over 1000ft long!

- We are mammals
- The females in the pride usually do all the hunting
- The males have a mane of hair around their face.

BLUE ROUTE RIDES



Fun Fact: As you pass Penguin Bay, did you know that you can find wild Humboldt Penguins living in warmer climates and can be spotted by the coast of Peru and Chile.

2. Rameses Revenge

Q. Rameses Revenge is one of our older rides
What year did it open?

3. Dragons Fury

- A. Kinetic moving energy and sound energy.

4. Activity Time - What Am I?

The Kobra ride was built in 2010 and reaches speeds of up to 69km/h!

Activity Time - What Am I?

Now it is time on our route for an activity stop. 'What am I' is a quick fire game, we have given you some ideas to use but we encourage you to let the students come up with some of their own!

How To Play:

1. Split the group into teams
2. We have given you two different rides to get you started along with 3 clues.
3. Encourage your groups to work together to decipher the rides.
4. If they guess correctly they score a point, if they do not then continue with the clues for the other teams.

7. Final Stop - The Griffallo River Ride Adventure!

Q. What is the force that slows the boat down once it hits the water on the Griffallo and Tiger Rock on a larger scale?
A. Water Resistance
